PUBLIC QUESTION TIME

Question: Resident Mrs Janice Pope

"Melview Drive between Terrigal and Warrandyte Roads includes school bus traffic and has seen traffic triple in the past 50 years and is a speedway. There are no speed humps or traffic islands and traffic is seen travelling on the wrong side of the road. Why has this area been bypassed by Council compared to new estates?"

Response: Adam Todorov - Acting Director Operations, Infrastructure and Leisure "Traffic studies have been undertaken in this area in recent years, with the results indicating that traffic is generally travelling at speeds that are at or below the default 50km/h speed limit.

To manage the safe movement of traffic through the Melview Drive / Leslie Grove intersection, a concrete splitter island will be installed at this location. This will be of particular benefit during peak times when the traffic is at its greatest volume. This project has been referred to Council's Local Area Traffic Management capital works program for funding prioritisation and future construction, which is not likely, based on current competing priorities, to occur within the next few years. Council's Engineers review the priorities associated with this program on an annual basis, and will communicate any changes to the priority to Mrs Pope accordingly."

Question: Resident Mrs Janice Pope

"The intersections of Dickson Crescent and Melview Drive with Warrandyte Road are dangerous. I give Council and Vic Roads 18 months before a vehicle drives into the commonwealth bank or into the Japanese restaurant or someone is killed or seriously injured. Why can't the pedestrian lights be moved and made into traffic lights to deal with the huge increase of traffic and congestion in and out of Dickson Crescent and Melview Drive? I haven't seen anyone monitoring those corners at peak times or on the weekends for years."

Response: Adam Todorov - Acting Director Operations, Infrastructure and Leisure "Both Warrandyte Road, as an arterial road, and the traffic signals, which are a Major Traffic Control Item, are the responsibility of VicRoads.

As such Council will arrange to forward this issue to VicRoads for investigation and response."

- 1. COUNCIL HAVING COMPLIED WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF SECTIONS 163A, 163B AND 223 OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1989 ("ACT"), AND OTHERWISE ACCORDING TO LAW, HEREBY DECLARES A SPECIAL CHARGE ("SPECIAL CHARGE") UNDER SECTION 163 OF THE ACT AS FOLLOWS:

- 3. COUNCIL, FOR THE PURPOSES OF HAVING DETERMINED THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF THE SPECIAL CHARGE TO BE LEVIED:
 - i. CONSIDERS AND FORMALLY RECORDS THAT ONLY THOSE RATEABLE PROPERTIES INCLUDED IN THE SOLAR SAVER SCHEME AS PROPOSED WILL DERIVE A SPECIAL BENEFIT FROM THE IMPOSITION OF THE SPECIAL CHARGE, AND THERE ARE NO COMMUNITY BENEFITS TO BE PAID BY COUNCIL; AND
 - ii.
