 - VALUE AND USE, OCCUPATION AND ENJOYMENT OF THE PROPERTIES INCLUDED IN THE SCHEME,

WILL BE MAINTAINED AND ENHANCED THROUGH INCREASED ECONOMIC ACTIVITY.

- COUNCIL FURTHER CONSIDERS, AND FORMALLY DETERMINES FOR xi. THE PURPOSES OF SECTIONS 163(2)(A), (2A) AND (2B) OF THE ACT, THAT THE ESTIMATED PROPORTION OF THE TOTAL BENEFITS OF THE SCHEME TO WHICH THE PERFORMANCE OF THE FUNCTION OR THE EXERCISE OF THE POWER RELATES (INCLUDING ALL SPECIAL BENEFITS AND COMMUNITY BENEFITS) THAT WILL ACCRUE AS SPECIAL BENEFITS TO ALL OF THE PERSONS WHO ARE LIABLE TO PAY THE SPECIAL RATE AND CHARGE IS IN A RATIO OF 1:1 (OR 100%). - xii.
